

Member Spotlight ~ Don Shropshire Posted by Jerry Harris on Feb 14, 2014



Don Shropshire has lived an accomplished life. A member of the Rotary Club of Tucson since 1967, Don has served our Rotary Club and his community in an exemplary manner while garnering many well deserved awards for his professional accomplishments. Donald Gray Shropshire was born on August 6, 1927 in Winston Salem, North Carolina. He graduated from the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill with a degree in Commerce in 1950. He then went to graduate school at the University of Chicago Graduate School of Business. He obtained a degree in Hospital Administration in 1959. Don also has an Honorary Doctor of Laws Degree from the University of Arizona and Honorary Degree of

Doctor of Education from Tucson University.

Don served in hospital management positions in Kentucky and Maryland prior to coming to Tucson Medical Center in 1967, where he served as President and Chief Executive Officer until his retirement in 1992. During that time he was founding director and Board Chairman of Partners Health Plan. Upon his retirement, he was named President Emeritus of Tucson Medical Center.

Don has been very active in local, regional, and national health care organizations, including service on the Boards of the American Hospital Association, the Healthcare Forum of the Arizona Hospital Association, and the Southern Arizona Hospital Council, the latter three as chairman. He was a founding member of the Voluntary Hospitals of America and served on its Board of Directors. He also is past Chairman of the National Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education.

Don's civic service includes, but is not limited to, Arizona Chamber of Commerce, Chairman, Arizona Town Hall, University of Arizona College of Fine Arts, Deans Board as Chairman. Additionally, Don has served on the board of the University of Arizona Steele Memorial Children's Research Center, Tucson Economic Development Corporation, and Chairman of the Tucson Airport Authority.

Governor Bruce Babbitt appointed Mr. Shropshire in 1982 to the Arizona Board of Regents for an eight year term. He served as President of the Board from July 1987 through June 1988. Governor Symington appointed him to the Arizona Health Facilities Board in 1992 and he was reappointed in 1999 by Governor Hull. He has served as Director of First Interstate Bank of Arizona, the Tucson Electric Power Company, and Unisource. Don is listed in many Who's Who publications.

Don Shropshire received the Tucson Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce 1987 Man of the Year Award.

Don and his wife, Mary Ruth, have two children. Melanie David lives in Tucson and is Director of Waypoint Theater in Tucson. Devin is a broker for Wells Fargo in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. Don and Mary Ruth have three grandchildren. In 1997, Don was named Tucson Father of the Year.

Before moving to Tucson, Don was active in civic work in Maryland and Kentucky. He joined the Rotary Club of Tucson in 1967. He served as Vice President in 1971, President in 1993-1994, and received perhaps the highest honor that can be achieved in the Rotary Club of Tucson, the Orville McPherson Award, in 2008. Don believes the biggest challenge confronting our club today is balancing social and service obligations. He notes that as our service obligations increase every year, it gets harder to balance these obligations with social events for club members to enjoy each other and cultivate friendships.

When asked about his favorite memory of being President of the Rotary Club of Tucson, Don smiled and said that he had a concern because we, as a club, had lost touch with the Bell Ringing Program of the Salvation Army. He said he approached Mike Anderson and asked if he would try to get us involved. Don says Mike's enthusiasm, energy, and organizational skills helped us launch a new era of successful fundraising with the Salvation Army.

Last, but not least, the always dapper Don Shropshire has the most impressive collection of bow ties in Tucson.
