Gift of Life-AZ an Arizona Rotary Project of Districts 5490, 5500 and 5510 Posted by David Gallaher on Mar 13, 2014



The Gift of Life-Arizona (GOL-AZ) became a 501 (c) (3) project of the Rotary Club in the Arizona Rotary Districts 5490, 5500 and 5510 in the mid 1980's with the mission to provide medical and surgical intervention for needy children from around the world who are suffering from congenital heart defects. Over these many years, they have established a working relationship with Pediatric Cardiologists and Surgeons in Arizona, Mexico and

GOL-AZ's long term goal was to provide the assistance to 300 children by year end 2013. This goal was realized this last October with the 300th child receiving heart surgery at the

University of Arizona Medical Center by heart surgeon, Dr. Michael Teordori. The GOL-AZ project has now helped 302 needy children from 24 countries, of which 29 are from Arizona, have an opportunity for a more normal and health life.

Biography - Gary Whiting - Centennial Past District Governor, Rotary District 5510

Gary Whiting has belonged to five Rotary Clubs ranging in size from 24 to 350+ members in five districts. Since becoming a member of The Rotary Club of Sun Lakes, Arizona District 5510 in 1994, he has served as:
