#### Pima Community College: Challenges and Opportunities Posted by Cheryl House on Mar 20, 2014



Lee D. Lambert has been Chancellor of Pima Community College since July 2013. Chancellor Lambert will discuss the activities PCC is undertaking as it works with area educators, businesses and community leaders to foster student success and economic development.

### Biography - Lee D. Lambert, J.D.

Before coming to PCC, Chancellor Lambert was President of Shoreline Community College in Shoreline, Wash., outside Seattle, serving from June 2006-June 2013. He also served as Interim President, and was Vice President for Human Resources and

Legal Affairs at Shoreline from January 2005-June 2006.

He also has served as Vice President for Human Resources and Legal Affairs at Centralia College in Centralia, Wash., and as Special Assistant to the President for Civil Rights and Legal Affairs at The Evergreen State College in Olympia, Wash.

Chancellor Lambert is a board member of the American Association of Community Colleges (AACC) and participated in AACC's Vocational Education Leadership Training Program. He is board chair of the National Coalition of Certification Centers and is a founding member of the Manufacturing Institute Education Council.

Chancellor Lambert received a Juris Doctor degree from the Seattle University School of Law and a bachelor's degree in Liberal Arts from The Evergreen State College in Olympia, Wash.

He often is asked to speak at national and international conferences. He recently spoke at the International Conference on Community Colleges and at AACC's 20th Annual Workforce Development Institute, where he presented on "The Keys to Collaboration: K-12 and Workforce Relationships."

A frequent visitor to Asia, Chancellor Lambert has been asked by the governments of China and India to speak to educators in those countries about the critical role community


#### 1) The Tucsotarian
