#### **Border Flavors, What Makes Us Unique** Posted by Robert Logan on Apr 04, 2014



Janos Wilder will discuss how he came to an understanding of the flavors of the border and what makes the flavors here in Southern Arizona unique. Janos will describe how the ecology of the region as well as the influence of Indian, Spanish and Mexican traditions have combine to create the ingredients, foods and flavors that define our culinary identity. The talk will end with a discussion of a new initiative to name Tucson a UNICESCO City of Gastronomy.

### **Biography of Janos Wilder**

Born: February 5, 1954, Redwood City, California

Education: Ravenswood High School, East Palo Alto, California, 1972 University of California, Berkeley, CA, BA Political Science, 1976

Chef Janos Wilder began cooking as a teenager in a local pizza parlor and continued cooking throughout high school and college in numerous restaurants in Northern California. Nashville, Tennessee and Boulder, Colorado. Working his way up through restaurants came easily to Wilder and he used his experience as a means to support himself while attending the University of Colorado and later while getting a degree in political science from UC Berkeley.

On Halloween, 1983, Janos opened its doors in a landmark adobe home in Barrio Viejo on the grounds of the Tucson Museum of Art. Within months the restaurant was written up in the New York Times and in 1984 was named one of the nation's top regional restaurants by Playboy magazine.

In 1990 wrote Janos: Recipes and Tales from a Southwest Restaurant published by Berkeley's Ten Speed Press. In 1998 the restaurant relocated to its present home in a free standing building on the grounds of the Westin La Paloma Resort and Spa overlooking the entire Tucson Valley. Speaker – Dr. Fayes K Ghishan, MD, Director of the U of A Steele Children's Research Center

**Dr. Ghishan** gave a great talk showing everyone that the key to good health is the bacterial flora in the gut. Some of the highlights were: The health of bacterial flora in our body determines a great deal of our overall health. Stress has a negative impact on the health of the gut's bacteria. Gut bacteria can be "fingerprinted" which reveals a great deal about a person, even their temperament. There is a

British dating service that uses stool samples to evaluate matches! Eat the strings on your bananas – they contain prebiotics that your gut needs. Obese rats can be restored to a healthy weight by simply implanting the bacteria from a normal weight rat into the gut of the obese rat. "The road to good health is paved with good intestines."
