Ron Barber (born August 25, 1945) has been a member of the United States House of Representatives from Arizona, served as district director for U.S. Representative Gabrielle Giffords who resigned her seat. He won the Democratic nomination for the special election to finish Giffords' term and was sworn into office on June 19,

In the 2012 general election, he was elected to a full term. His district —numbered as the 8<sup>th</sup> district in 2012, and as the 2<sup>nd</sup> district since 2013-includes the eastern two-thirds of Tucson, as well as the southeastern corner of Arizona. Barber is running for re-election in

2014.

Barber was born in Wakefield, West Riding of Yorkshire, England, shortly after World War II. Barber's father was an airman stationed at Davis-Monthan Air Force Base. Barber graduated from Tucson's Rincon High School in 1963, and earned a B.A. from the University of Arizona in 1967.

He and his wife Nancy live in Tucson, Arizona; the couple has two daughters. They have operated a small business for 22 years.



Raúl M. Grijalva (born February 19, 1948) is the U.S. Representative for Arizona's 3<sup>rd</sup> congressional district, serving since 2003. The district, numbered as the 7th District from 2003 to 2013, includes the western third of Tucson, all of Yuma and Nogales, and some peripheral parts of metro Phoenix.

Raúl M. Grijalva's father was a migrant worker from Mexico. Grijalva was born in Tucson, Arizona, and graduated from Sunnyside High School in 1967. He is a 2004 inductee to the Sunnyside High School Alumni Hall of Fame. He attended the University of Arizona and

earned a bachelor's degree in Sociology.

Grijalva and his wife Ramona have three daughters.

All Rotarians have a life outside of Rotary and all Presidents face some challenges during their year. This past week, we lost Susan's mom, Marie Christine Gaudielle. Since you all are our friends I thought I would share a little bit about Marie. Marie was an incredible woman who faced many hardships during her life but always managed to be a positive force in and around anyone she ever met. She raised five children on her own during the



60s and 70s when that was a different time for single mothers. She had relatively little material things and had no use for them but she marveled at the world and stopped each day to admire a sunset, her hummingbird feeder, her favorite roadrunner, the current weather, her bridge club, and of course her grandchildren and great grandchildren. She was a wonderful grandmother to all of our RYE students and was most supportive

of Susan and myself in all of our Rotary activities. She particularly loved our Club home hospitality and we always included her and she enjoyed telling many stories of the "old" Tucson days. She was a resident of Tucson for sixty years.

She particularly enjoyed talking and joking with Herb Bloom whom we always invited over for those affairs as he lived close by.

Marie was a consummate care giver herself when she went back to school and got her LPN license. She spent ten years providing the best possible love and care to her husband Dr. Andrew Gaudielle who would pass from Parkinsons. She had a voracious appetite for reading all things and could easily discuss any subject. She was a scrabble warrior and a professional cross word puzzle person.

Like most grandmas, she spent the holidays with me in our kitchen arguing about the best way to make gravy. They were fun arguments and she always won. She also had a tough time figuring out my wacky sense of humor and finally figured me out. In the early part of my 25 years with Susan, she was not always fond of my fishing trips, but learned how much they meant to me and finally accepted the meaning of them as I was her favorite son-in-law (the only one) and she was my favorite mother-in-law. So it is affectionately appropriate that I did not make this past week's trip. She taught me valuable lessons of tolerance for others.

She spent the last two and half months in Kanmar Place, which is part of Casa de la Luz. She went in knowing her caregivers would be fantastic and we are forever grateful for their love and care. I do not know how these beautiful people do what they do. I know that many of our membership are caregivers now or at some point in their lives, and it is the last act of kindness for those we cherish and love.
