Public Mental Health Care in Pima County Posted by Dorothy Kret on Jul 24, 2014



The Community Partnership of Southern Arizona (CPSA) is the Regional Behavioral Health Authority (RBHA) contracted by the state of Arizona to coordinate and manage publicly funded behavioral health services for children, adults and their families in Pima County. CPSA coordinates, by way of a provider network, the delivery of mental health and substance use treatment services, and behavioral health wellness and prevention services.

CPSA is a community-based, non-profit organization that is dedicated to ensuring that individuals and families receive accessible, high-quality behavioral health services that are member and family

driven, recovery oriented, respectful of cultural differences, and foster hope and self-determination.

As one of four RBHAs statewide, CPSA contracts with behavioral health agencies in Pima County to provide mental health and substance use treatment services for eligible individuals. Prevention programs are also provided for children, adults, families, and the community. In collaboration with members and families receiving services, providers, and other key stakeholders, CPSA continuously strives to improve quality of care and respond to changing community behavioral health needs.

Neal Cash Biography

Neal Cash is President and Chief Executive Officer of Community Partners, Inc. and its subsidiary, Community Partnership of Southern Arizona (CPSA). CPSA serves as the Regional Behavioral Health Authority contracted by the Arizona Department of Health Services Division of Behavioral Health Services to manage the public behavioral health system in southern Arizona.

Neal has a bachelor's degree in psychology from Syracuse University and a master's degree in rehabilitation counseling and administration from the University of Arizona.

Neal has served on many task forces, expert panels, and boards of directors on a local, state and national level. Neal is a tenured board member of the National Council for Behavioral Health, an organization that promotes recovery from mental illness and addictions through public policy advocacy, leadership and workforce development, and organizational and practice improvement. Neal also served as part of the National GAINS Center National Leadership Forum on Behavioral Health/Criminal Justice Services.
