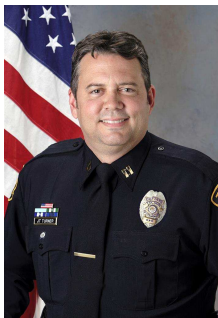

Law Enforcement in Tucson - TPD SWAT

Captain JT Turner of the Tucson Police Department's Specialized Response Division will provide an overview of the Department's Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) Team. He will discuss the unit's mission and the types and frequency of calls that the team responds to. He will explain some of the tools and tactics used by the team and the philosophy and history behind the creation and use of SWAT teams in law enforcement. Tools and equipment utilized by the Tucson SWAT Team will be on display and members of the team will be available to explain the tools and equipment and answer questions.

Captain JT Turner - Biography

Captain JT Turner is a 27 year veteran of the Tucson Police Department. He joined the police department after serving four years as a Law Enforcement Specialist in the United States Air Force. He started his career serving as a patrol officer, Field Training Officer and undercover officer in the Major Offenders Unit. JT was promoted to Detective in 1994. As a detective, he served in the Burglary Task Force, Major Offenders Unit, Special Investigations – Vice and Organized Crime Units and in the Office of Internal Affairs. JT was promoted to Sergeant in 2001 supervising patrol squads, a divisional street crimes unit, and served Department members and their families for two years as a full-time counselor in the Department's Behavioral Sciences Unit. JT was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant 2007. As a lieutenant JT has commanded in patrol operations, gang interdiction, violent crimes, and was responsible for recruiting and background investigations in the Human Resources Division. As a lieutenant JT also served three years as the commander of the Hostage Negotiations Unit. He was promoted to Captain in February 2014 and is the commanding officer of the Department's Specialized Response Division overseeing the Special Weapons and Tactics Team (SWAT), Hostage Negotiations, Bomb Squad, K-9 Unit, and the Air Support Unit. JT is a graduate of Northwestern University's School of Police Staff and Command – Class 230, the Police Executive Research Forum's Senior Management Institute for Police – Session 56 and holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Public Safety Administration from Grand Canyon University.
