Social Security; History, Myths, and Strategies Posted by Patrick Zumbusch on Aug 14, 2014



With 8,000 or more new people each day qualifying for Social Security benefit payments, this Federal program impacts more than 63 million Americans. Financially speaking, the impact of this benefit is large but, unfortunately, the knowledge or comfort most people have about Social Security is rudimentary at best and confusion reigns.

Pat Zumbusch - Biography

Patrick Zumbusch is the Principal of Wellspring Financial Partners, a Tucson-based investment advisory practice. His firm does individual financial plans / wealth management as well as provides education to company savings plans (401(k) / 403(b), etc.). A primary tenet of Pat's philosophy is that wisely planning for one's financial future investing is hard, but it does not have to be as hard as Wall Street makes it out to be. Wellspring currently serves more than 10,000 participants in 43 states.

Most of Pat's background was in running enterprises in the for-profit space. His coming to Tucson occurred in 1989 when he was hired as a President of a University of Arizona offshoot that measured lightning, an entity that was twice rated as one of the fastest growing private companies in the state. He later ran the Community Food Bank of Southern Arizona, where he saw first-hand the challenges facing families who are poor. His passion for helping families stems from that background and a rural Minnesota upbringing.

His educational background is a dual major in accounting & finance from Augsburg College, an MBA from the University of Chicago. He is a CPA (Inactive) & holds his CFP.
