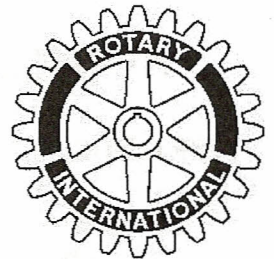

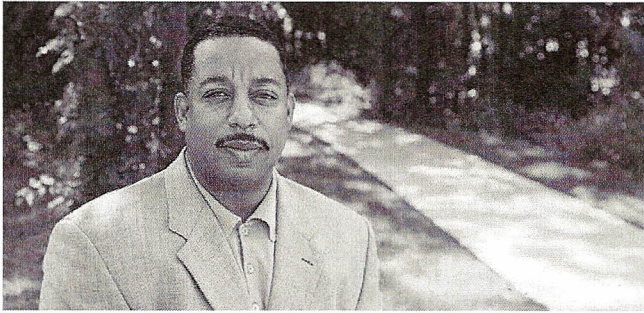

Lemuel Randolph

Director, Parks and Recreation

Lemuel Randolph came to Arlington in 2014 from the City of McKinney where he served as the Director of Parks, Recreation and Open Spaces. With a total of 20 years of experience directing municipal parks and recreation departments, Randolph has also worked for the cities of Missouri City, Sugar Land and San Bernardino.

Randolph was named parks director in McKinney in 2007. Under his leadership, the city opened the first phase of Bonnie Wenk Park, featuring the city's first dog park, hike-and-bike trails, and a 30,000-square-foot skate park. He also supervised an agreement with Plano Sports Authority to create a 90,000-square-foot recreation building at Gabe Nesbitt Community Park.

Other accomplishments include the acquisition of more than 550 acres for future city parks and the development of 12 neighborhood parks, while at McKinney.

Alaska Department of Fish and Game is advising hikers, hunters, and fishermen to take extra precautions and keep alert of bears while in the field. We advise that campers wear noisy little bells on their clothing so as not to startle bears that aren't expecting them. We also advise campers to carry pepper spray with them in case of an encounter with a bear. It is also a good idea to watch out for fresh signs of bear activity. Campers should recognize the difference between black bear and grizzly bear dung. Black bear dung is smaller and contains lots of berries and squirrel fur. Grizzly bear dung has little bells in it and smells like pepper
