Check out Rotary.org for a list of the 64 different Rotary Fellowships. They range from Amateur Radio to Cooking to Cycling to Fishing to Music to Scuba Diving and beyond.

How do I start a Rotary Fellowship?

Chances are if you have a strong interest in something, there are others in the Rotary family who share it. Forming a fellowship starts with finding members for your group. Here's how you can start:

- Join a discussion group or start a new one. It's a great way to share your interest with other members to build interest.
- Ask your district Rotary Fellowships chair for assistance. Reach out to district Rotary Fellowships chairs in other countries to build membership. Ask for contact information at rotaryfellowships@rotary.org.
- Be sure you meet the criteria for a fellowship and apply for official recognition. See the Rotary Fellowships Handbook @ Rotary.org for details.

Four Flag Day Rain Reminders :

1) Our Subscription Agreements state the following: "In the case of or threat of inclement weather, Arlington Sunrise Rotary will display your flag the Saturday following the holiday listed above. The threat of inclement weather shall be defined as any rain, thunderstorm, or snow with a greater than 75% chance forecasted by the National Weather Service. Note also that in order to prevent damage to our flags, we may also leave flags out overnight if they are wet, in order to allow them to dry before rolling and storing them for the next flag holiday."

2) If at all possible, we want to display flags on the holiday, and NOT the next Saturday. Although it's okay if there is a really light rain when we put the flags out, since they dry out fairly quickly, we will NOT put them out if it's pouring or a lightening storm in the morning.

3) Regardless of when we put the flags out, we can **NOT** retrieve wet flags because they will mildew. If flags are at all still wet, then we leave them out until the next day when they are dry.

4) Bottom line - it's always a game time decision often made on a team-by-team basis.
