

When the Stay at Home guidelines were introduced, our office made arrangements for almost everyone to work from home. Our office is officially closed, however a small number of employees go into our office on a rotation basis. My business and the real estate market has slowed down however there is still activity in the market with new listings, properties under contract, and closings. Buyer demand is still present in our market, and everyone is taking necessary health precautions to keep safe. Being proactive and updating my clients daily on the market and local news has been very important as everyone wants to know exactly what is going on and how they may be effected. Like most people now, I have adapted to working from home and juggling additional day to day responsibilities. I only hope that those who are unable to work right now can get back to work as soon as possible and safely.

Shortly after the Covid-19 guidelines were put into place and the severity became more apparent, my family along with a neighboring family, started a fundraising campaign to sell yards signs to show our appreciation to Healthcare and all essential workers. All proceeds are being donated to Shore Medical Center's Covid-19 Fund. The response from the community has been fantastic and overwhelming, so much so that we can say we have sold nearly 300 signs and raised almost \$15,000 in 3 weeks. People love the idea of our yard signs and are eager to donate and show off their sign on their front lawn. We sell & deliver signs each day and ask our communities to please donate, if they can, to Shore Medical Center's Covid-19 Fund and they will receive a sign. We have delivered signs to homes in many towns throughout Cape May and Atlantic counties.


Local Ocean City Red Cross Blood Drive Thursday, May 7th
