Gippsland Rotary Centenary House (GRCH) is a community-based not-for-profit accommodation

a community-based not-for-profit accommodation facility, for patients and their families who are attending the Gippsland Cancer Care Centre and Latrobe Regional Hospital (LRH).

This project was initiated by Gippsland Rotary Clubs to mark the Centenary of Rotary International, and has attracted broad community support and representation throughout Gippsland. Funds have been raised through community fundraising, applications to philanthropic trusts, sponsorship and donations in kind.

The facility comprises thirty large 'motel style' en suite units, two with full disabled access bathrooms. Communal kitchens, dining areas and lounges, 'Quiet Room' for family consultation and privacy, reading area, secure playground and community room are also part of the complex. Our Club donates annually to this very worthwhile facility.

END POLIO NOW—The goal of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative is to ensure that no child anywhere will ever again be paralysed by any form of poliovirus. Launched in 1988 after the World Health Assembly passed a resolution to eradicate Polio, the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, along with its partners, has helped countries to make huge progress in protecting the global population from this debilitating disease. As a result, global incidence of polio has decreased by 99.9% since GPEI's foundation. An estimated 16 million people today are walking who would otherwise have been paralysed by the disease, and more than 1.5 million people are alive, whose lives would otherwise have been lost. Now the task remains to tackle polio in its last few strongholds and get rid of the final 0.1% of polio

INTERNATIONAL PROJECT

Adopt a School Project

Our aim for this project since 2009, has been to provide on-going help to the Indonesian village primary school of Banyuning in the District of Abang. Located on the north-east coast of the island of Bali, the area is renowned for its harsh climate, lack of water and extreme poverty. The school's official title is School No.3, Bunatan Banyuning, and although we always have a little difficulty communicating with the students, our message is clear, and the infectious smiles of the young students is heart-warming.

From the earliest visits, the visiting Rotarians have always had a specific goal in mind, so that our time spent in the school community is beneficial. Initially we provided gifts of books and stationery. After that first contact we were able to focus on specific needs of the community, so our role evolved into one which supported maintenance and hygiene .

Projects undertaken to date are:

- 2010 Sporting equipment and new uniforms.
- 2011 More uniforms and white boards for the school.
- 2012 New Library, book shelves, Desks, New Sick Bay
- 2013 More school uniforms and 4 new toilets.
- 2014 Repaired and repainted the sick bay.2015 New Uniforms and a medical kit for the sick bay.
- 2016 New toilets for the boys.
- 2017 Provision of books and pens for classroom
- 2020 Supply of face masks during COVID
- 2023 New toilet block and tuck shop
- 2024 New uniforms
