# PRESIDENT'S REPORT

## 2009-10



R.I. President John Kenny's theme for this year has been "The Future of Rotary is in your Hands" a philosophy which the Rotary Club of Moe took literally. His international goals addressing health, literacy, water and hunger were mirrored by those of our club, with Moe's plans to address worldwide water needs extending into next year.

To complement these aims, my personal goals centred on membership, community service, improved communication, club interactions, Polio Plus and youth involvement.

### CLUB ACHIEVEMENTS:

**Dealing With Change** - Our year commenced with many members vacationing interstate and overseas, and low attendances created organisational concerns, especially for long range planning. Numbers were further affected by the retention of 3 inactive members who did not resume their Rotary connections.

We decided to shift our dinner meetings to Moe RSL, and as our travellers returned, the club once again began to flourish. We attracted 2 new members in Rhonda Crooks and Daniel Barry, and amazingly, by late February, we had recorded successive 100% dinner attendances. Our new venue ticks all the boxes relating to space, ambience, value and quality.

**The Ideal of Service** - Moe has been totally committed to Polio Eradication, raising significant funds and celebrating Polio Awareness Day with the Hazelwood Club, on Rotary's 105<sup>th</sup> birthday.

We made unprecedented contributions to Shelter Boxes in response to a natural disaster, this time due to the earthquake in Haiti. Once again Rotary Centenary House and Gippsland Cancer Care were major beneficiaries, while Latrobe Regional Hospital and the Rotary Garden Project also received invaluable funding.

**On the Social Front** - Socially, we enjoyed an exciting and varied program encompassing a movie night, wine and cheese evening, Octoberfest, the 9820 Conference in Sale, Brian Gregory's inspired French themed visit to Mont de Lancey, International Goodwill celebrations – the list goes on and on! It's still hard to imagine that club members participated in Bocce and Croquet. Extreme sports, indeed!

**Interclub Visits** - Our club hosted Morwell (twice) and Hazelwood, and we visited Mirboo North, Hazelwood and Trafalgar. A combination of programs ranging from Trivia Challenge, guest speakers, sports evening and debate were thoroughly enjoyed by all who participated.

**Improved Communications** - Due to some fantastic sponsorship, over two years, from Future Knowledge, web-master Bryon Puddy developed our new club web-site. It will continue to be a work in progress, but the possibilities are endless, and approximately \$2000 pa is now re-directed to service projects as a result of Bulletin production savings.

We were also pleased to welcome the then Presidents of Newborough and Moe Probus, Darrel Benjamin and Tony Paul and their wives, as a tribute to the long-standing relationship between the Rotary Club of Moe and Probus.

## THE FOUR AVENUES OF SERVICE:

The key to cohesive club operations can be determined by the active participation of its leaders and members. My absolute gratitude goes to all Board members, and in particular, the various chairs. Len Cairns, Ross Maxfield, Michael Koch and President Elect Wendy Farmer contributed greatly to an outstanding year, ably supported by Bryon Puddy and Barry Dunstan who supplied the necessary mentorship and wisdom. To round things off, PP Neil Thompson and new blood Kishor Manani were wonderful back ups.

### Is it any wonder that a Rotary year flies by so quickly!

Just some of the wonderful outcomes generated by Board this year include –

- Heart-warming generosity displayed by Michael Koch and Neil McCluskey, and more recently Len Cairns, as they endeavour to provide uniforms and school books for students living in the impoverished fishing village of Bhunatan in northern Bali.
- Upgrading of club promotion and community awareness through improved signage, Rotary banners, brochures and club displays.
- Promotion of vocational awareness through Pride of Workmanship awards locally.
- Another highly successful Gippsland Rotary Golf Classic, admirably led by John Hutchinson, providing in excess of \$11,000 for Rotary disbursement.
- Active club participation in Vocational, Membership, New Generations, Rotary Foundation and World Understanding months.
- Community service projects including the Botanic Gardens lighting and our collaboration with Work for the Dole to construct Cool Room and tandem trailers.
- Weekly programs which were varied, informative and enjoyable thanks to Barry Dunstan's organisation. Barry's ability to chair meetings with polish and flair led to me recruiting his skills on many occasions.

Julian Yeatman almost reluctantly accepted another term as Treasurer. It is because of his diligence and persistence that he carries out this task so well.

The first person chosen for my board was Secretary Diane Wilkinson. Di has had an extremely busy year outside of Rotary in so many ways, all of which make her achievements the more commendable. At the outset I promised to ease the weight of the role, without much success I admit, but I am incredibly appreciative of her professional approach and forthrightness.

### Recognition of our Local Youth:

Our focus all year has included promoting and supporting young people. No sooner had our French Youth Exchange visitor, Cesar Olange arrived, we were farewelling his predecessor, Florian Sutterluty. Coincidentally, Florian returned to Austria and within months Moe interviewed then farewelled Melissa Howlett who is spending 2010 in Austria.

The Youth Exchange Program is very robust in Moe, and is well supported by Wendy Farmer, who, like me, thanks host families Sandra and Pash, Norma and John and Maria and David for their huge contributions to Cesar's well-being and comfort. Cesar has grown immensely in the past 12 months, and has been a marvellous ambassador.

The club should be grateful for Chris Lampel's support and guidance of the many young people who participated in the leadership and enrichment programs RYLA and RYPEN, the National Science Youth Forum, Siemen's Science, the Model United Nations Assembly and the Secondary College debate recently hosted between Lowanna and Kurnai. Future leaders spoke to the club about their experiences on the Kokoda Track, Latrobe City Junior Council and the Science Forum, and we found the presentations both passionate and accomplished.

### Recognition of Service:

Our club is extremely appreciative of the work, participation and commitment of PP John Hutchinson, and we have much pleasure in adding a sapphire pin to the Paul Harris Fellowship bestowed on John in 1996.

The Rotary Foundation directs PHF contributions to carry out an array of projects world-wide. John is a worthy recipient of this award, and I congratulate him on his fine achievement.

I also am delighted to acknowledge my Rotary mentor and friend, Bryon Puddy, who has provided immeasurable personal assistance over the past two years. In addition, he continues to provide outstanding leadership in the areas of club website, Rotary Foundation, to procedural issues and as a nominated Board Member. He is a deserved recipient of the 2009/10 Moe Rotarian of the Year.

### What's next?

I applaud Wendy Farmer for accepting the honour and challenges that go with the Presidency, and wish her well for the coming year.

All in all, I wish to thank club members for providing me with the honour of leading the Rotary Club of Moe over the past 12 months. In conclusion, I must also highlight the support and acceptance provided by Irene, without which I would have faltered badly.

### Youth Exchange Program

During the year we had **César Olagne** on an inbound student exchange from France. The day was a great success and following a wet start was enjoyed by over 100 players. This was a good fundraiser having earned \$12000.00 towards the service activities of the club. Our thanks go out to all who helped and our many generous sponsors.

# COMMUNITY SERVICE REPORT

The Community Service Committee has, in this Rotary year, had a very busy programme of events and responsibilities. As chair I would like to thank all members for their dedicated work and for the support they have given the committee and the Rotary Club of Moe over this year.

Activities this year have included a number of major projects and some additional works across the Moe community which have both benefitted the community and added to some of the Club's beautification projects.

## ACTIVITIES:

### Moe Botanic Gardens

This project is a long-term one partially funded by Latrobe City. This last year we have been installing tower lights to better illuminate the park from the Narracan drive end to the Tennis club. This will allow evening safety and better lighting for events. The reinforced bases for the light towers were prepared and put in place and the light poles are now being painted. This project should be near completion by the end of this Rotary year. Pash Demigistris and fellow Rotarians have worked hard to get this project close to completion in this Rotary year.

Thanks should also go to Rotarians Alan Sinnott and Bruce Paull for previous electrical and planning work on this ongoing project.

### Catering for Moe Events

Throughout the year we have provided catering for a number of events across Moe. First large event was the Moe Carols by Candle-light at Old Gippsdown where we provided free sausages and sold soft drinks.

In addition we catered for the TRUenergy Fun Run event at Yallourn and also for the Movies in the Park event sponsored by Latrobe City.

### Other Activities of the Committee

The Committee also supported the Frames project for Mainstreet Art painters with disabilities (some from Moe Lifeskills) and engaged in a number of other community support activities including the Apex/Lions Fireworks evening and all other Rotary Club events with good turn up and active involvement.

The Community Services Committee also undertook the completion of the Cool Room project which now means we have better refrigeration for all catering events. Thanks to the "Work for the Dole" group and GEST as well as Rotarians, Barry Dunstan, Dave Woods and his employer for their time and donations respectively for this project.

We are to yet to repaint the Picnic tables and seats in the Botanic Gardens, paint a section of St Aidan's Church and the Fishing Platform in the Botanic Gardens. We are also having the Rotary Club BBQ trailer refurbished after many years of reliable service and we have ordered a new set of "like keyed" padlocks for all our gate, shed, trailer and other equipment. We have also assisted the Yallourn North Primary School's breakfast programme and supported all other club events.

Special Thanks to both Committee member Rotarian Lynn Cassar for her catering prowess and extra work and to fellow Rotarian and PP Alan Sinnott for his support of this committee through works on and in the Club shed and other projects we have engaged in whilst he works on another committee. The support of President Roger Taylor and the Club Board throughout the year has been most helpful and the Committee has enjoyed the year.

### Fund Raising and Budget

During the year we held a Wine and Cheese Tasting night at Old Gippsdown which raised around \$700. Our other income for the Committee's work came from BBQ and Sausage sizzle activities and catering events and a series of raffles. Overall, the Committee budgeted for an approximate income for the year of \$6251 (includes the remaining part of the Latrobe City Botanic Gardens Lighting Grant) and an expenditure of \$5,700.

The Club spirit and Committee commitment of all members has been superb and whilst we have had some difficult tasks and large projects we have, in the end, had a very successful year. I thank all the Committee members for their work, support and "service above self" in the Rotary Club of Moe. I wish Mike Carter well as incoming chair of this Committee for 2010-2011.

I regret that I shall be away in the UK for this year's changeover and I wish incoming President Wendy Farmer all the best. My work takes me overseas quite often and I shall be back in August to continue my work for the Club.
