General Account

During this year the club raised \$5,400 from member subscriptions and the opening and closing balances remain essentially the same, as it has done for the last eight years, indicating that our subscription level is appropriately set. Rotary District, Rotary International per Capita fee and RI magazine charges now exceed \$6,000 Per year, Catering for the year, which is in addition to our Club Subscriptions, costs approximately \$17,500 for the year or an average of \$480 per member.

Movie Night


