Over the last twenty-seven years our club has supported many projects at a club level, at A62 District level and both national and international levels. At the present time fundraising efforts go towards the following;

Club Projects

- Making and supplying of small toilet bags for the Emergency Department at Latrobe Regional Health and the provision of larger, well stocked toilet bags for all other departments at Latrobe Regional Health. Crocheted and knitted rugs for the hospital to distribute where needed.
- Providing funds for primary school students to attend camps where unable due to financial hardship.
- Providing toiletries and knitted hats to the homeless for Saint Vincent de Paul Society to distribute.
- Donating Movie tickets at Christmas to older children who do not receive gifts at Christmas.
