Jack Young from Rotary International talked to the group about the Foundation Banquet on November 15th.

There will be an art auction this year and a Brown's football. Heavy hors d'ourves, wine, and soft drinks will be served.

The Shelter Box raised over \$53,000 this year to be sent to Nepal. He will travel to Nicaragua this December.

Morris Beverage, President of Lakeland Community College, spoke to the group about Issue 6 which will be on the ballot.

It is a Capital Improvement Bond Levy for .4 mills to expand and renovate the Allied Health facility. This will add 11 new areas of study. He asked for support for this levy.

Program: Our own Tony Mancari was the featured speaker this week and he spoke about "The World of Water- a Journey to your Tap."

Aqua America has been in existence for 125 years. It is the largest private water utility in Ohio spanning 17 counties and serving 500,000 Ohioans.

Most fresh water is underground and we use 3/10 of a percent of this water. 346 billion gallons of fresh water is used every day.

Eighty-five of us use public water and 15 percent use private, individual wells. About 850 million people in the world lack access to clean water.

Tony went on to discuss the history of water treatment, which began with the Greeks who filtered water through charcoal. Water was filtered in the 1700's and during the 1800's it was studied for germs due to the outbreak of cholera. Chlorine was first used in 1909 and by 1914 they were regulating contaminants. From 1974 until now contaminates are regulated by 100.

Tony showed great pictures of the Mentor Area Water Treatment Facility as he discussed the history of water distribution.

The water that we are drinking right now at lunch had fish swimming in it as little as eight to nin hours ago. The plant is manned 24-7. There are 11 Tony talked about the water utility as a business. Aqua investors own the utility that is regulated by the PUCO. The water industry has high fixed costs that exist whether you are treating the water or not. (This includes the pipes in the ground, etc.)

The average household uses 4,000 gallons per month at a cost of around \$30. There is still fluoride in the water.

There were many excellent questions asked by the group. The EPA will be looking at hormones and pharmaceuticals in the water now.
