**Program:** Our speaker this week was Tim McMarthy, the entrepre-

neur and philanthropist behind the Business of Doing Good.

He has started three successful businesses, along with The Business of Good Foundation

He also received the Ernst and Young's Entrepreneur of the Year and OSU's Fisher Business School Alumnus of the Year for Community Service.

His first company, Work-Place Media, is the largest at-work consumer media company in the United States according to LEK Consulting. Started in 1988 and sold in 2007, McCarthy repurchased the company in 2013 and it continues to serve national clients such as Nestle, McDonald's, Goodyear, Starbucks, Wrigley and Pfizer.

The second company is <u>Raising</u> <u>Cane's of Ohio</u>. It started in 2003 with his son, Tim, and partner Roy Getz, and has grown to 13 restaurants grossing over \$30 million in 2013.

With distiller Tom Lix, McCarthy helped launch The Cleveland Whis-

key Company in 2012.

The Business of Good Foundation is an engaged philanthropic organization that was created from McCarthy's passion for "serving those who serve the poor."



The Foundation's assistance takes the form of coaching, consulting and other business related support to nonprofits that help economically and socially disadvantaged people build their self-esteem and personal empowerment through education, employment and entrepreneurship.
