Stockhands Horses for Healing is a 501(c)3 non profit providing equine facilitated therapies to veterans, adults and children with developmental, mental, physician and emotional disabilities. Equine facilitated therapy is the use of horsemanship skills and activates to meet the needs and goals of students with disabilities. Tim shared therapeutic riding can help increase areas such as endurance, pride, confidence, purpose, control, and peace. How can you get involved? Volunteering to work with horses or monetary contributions to assist with tack, grain and hay are just a few options. Lessons are 7 days a week and feel free to stop in anytime and visit the facility located off Olentangy River Road.
