Renee Murry, Account Manager with the Ohio Machine, provided information about the professional lacrosse team that plays at Ohio Wesleyan University. The team started in 2012 as an expansion team in the Major League of Lacrosse (MLL). They have led the league in many stats in recent years and their goal is to make the Finals this year. The team gets its players through a draft of college players in December. This is not a full-time job for the players because they only make 10-25K per year based on whether they play or not. Many do not live in Central Ohio and fly in for weekends to play.

Through their Foundation, the team hosts tournaments, a K-2 and 35 and over league. They also raise funds for Big Brothers/Big Sisters and donate tickets to kids in the BB/BS program. They also provide fundraising packages to local high school teams.

During this year’s season, the team is hosting Theme Nights to include Scout Night, Military Appreciation Night, Family Night and Rotary Night. The Rotary Night will be held May 16 at 7pm. Tickets are \$10 and can be purchased on the website or by calling the ticket office. A percentage of ticket sales will be return to the Rotary Club. More information about the game is available in a flyer from the Ohio Machine.
