Program Highlights

Meredith Harrison, Ronald McDonald House (RMH) Charities, Central Ohio

Our local RMH is the largest and busiest in the world out of 322 houses in 63 countries.

They exist to partner with area hospitals and provide a home away from home for families with children receiving medical care and treatment, especially children who are seriously ill or injured .

It all began in 1974 from the sale of McDonald's Shamrock Shakes in Philadelphia, to support the care being provided for the daughter of Fred and Kim Hill.

The Central Ohio house offers seven events to raise support for their work.

They have 375 regular volunteers performing all sorts of jobs.

Three programs make up the RMH in Central Ohio, the House, Family Room and Care Mobile.

In 2015 27 Delaware County families (55 individuals) were served a total of 383 nights. Average length of stay was 14 nights.
