December 8, 2014 – Global clean water: Greg Bixler, PhD, P.E, the CEO of the humanitarian nonprofit Design Outreach, began by observing that 800 million people globally lack access to clean water and that 4100 people die every day from unsafe water -- equivalent to **10 full jetliners crashing** every day, day after day.

Efforts to provide clean water in Africa encounter **these problems**: 1) lack of sufficient **quantity** of water; 2) poor **quality** of drinking water (contaminated etc.); 3) the amount of time needed to collect and carry water from **faraway wells** (a full-time job that can keep farmers out of the fields and put women and girls out of school and at risk on the trails); and 4) **broken water pumps** (no repair supply chain, no skilled repair people). Because of these maintenance problems many NGO-installed water systems are broken and unused only a short time later.

Design Outreach, with Battelle colleagues, has designed LifePump, a pump system that can drill **twice as deep** as other drills (Bixler said one in three drilling efforts fails because drills can't go deep enough to get to water – devastating the hopes of villagers) and is far **more durable** and more easily serviced. The hand-powered pumps – which are worked all day -- can be monitored by satellite to assess any maintenance needs.

DesignOutreach has launched a “Hundred Pump Project”, a partnership with World Vision and private donors to install 100 Lifepumps in 5 African countries before the end of 2015. This achievement would provide clean water to up to 40,000 people. To fund a pump, \$9,200 must be raised, which will then be matched by partners. The pumps are manufactured in Sunbury, OH.

**Board meeting: President Larry** announced that there will be a board meeting after Monday's club meeting.

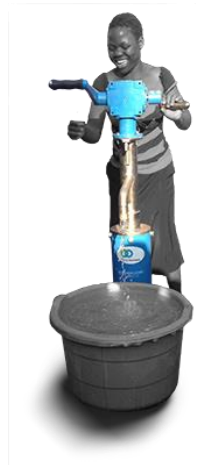
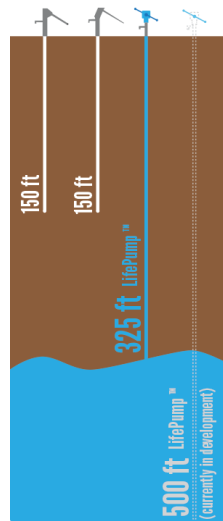
**Larry Harris** – is reconvening the Four-Way Test speech contest committee, which he said comprises all previous members, and new volunteers will also be welcome.
