**Program:** Marlene Casini introduced OWU president Rock Jones who has been president since 2008. He came to OWU from Hendricks College in Arkansas. Rock has a Masters of Divinity from Duke College, and he sits on the Delaware County Foundation and Strand Theatre boards.

Rock offered a bit of OWU history. The college was founded in 1842 by Reverend Adam Poe who raised funds to purchase the Mansion House Hotel when it closed. He also solicited funds from Methodist churches in the area to provide scholarships for students.

OWU has three guiding principles:

1. To forever be devoted to liberal principles.
2. To be open to all students regardless of religious affiliation
3. To be designed for the benefit of citizens in general.

Some of the challenges OWU faces include:

1. Changing demographics. Fewer students are graduating from high schools in Ohio; therefore, the pool from which OWU draws is shrinking.

- Affordability. Median income in the US is down and tuition is up. Rock noted the net cost to families for students attending OWU has actually dropped 3 ½ % in real dollars over the past few years.
- Return on investment. In 2018, 63% of all jobs will require some sort of post-secondary education. The median and lifetime incomes for college graduates is much greater than those for high school graduates.

OWU's responses to the challenges:

- OWU Connection: This initiative marries classroom teaching and real life experiences with travel learning classes, internships, and other opportunities.
- Construction
  - Merrick Hall is being fully renovated to house the OWU Connection and provide a lovely meeting space for the public.
  - Edwards Gym is being converted to a fitness center and will include a dance studio.
  - Elliot Hall has been restored and reopened (the original Mansion House).
- OWU enjoys community support, as evidenced by the reenergizing of the Bishop Backers organization.
