Board News: At a recent board meeting, the board approved the following:

The Club will absorb the cost of two meals of a guest attending a regular Monday meeting. The waiver is intended only for a guest of a current member inviting the person with the sole purpose of introducing him/her to Rotary, with the intent of proposing the individual for membership. Application of this waiver will be done on an honor basis such that additional records, other than signing in as a guest at the attendance table, are not required.

Program: Paul Craft, Superintendent of Delaware City Schools presented “Building Our Future,” an overview of the recent construction projects financed with the 2 mill bond issue passed in November. Craft noted Delaware county schools are #1 in the state in student performance. In 2013-14 school, Delaware schools were awarded the Excellent with Distinction designation, a remarkable achievement given that in 2000, the system was on academic watch. He also mentioned the system spends well below the state average per student education.

The recent bond issue will renovate the buildings, with the elementary schools returning to K-5, middle school 6-8, and Hayes with 9-12 graders. Security at all buildings has been improved, and Willis will be used for administration and will also be available for public use.

Craft asked Rotarians to advocate for school funding, particularly in Delaware if we happen to run into Senator Jordan or Rep. Brenner.
