- Richard Zechial, sponsored by Larry Harris, was inducted into membership.
- Gary Mittendorf has been voted an honorary member of our club, meaning he can attend at any time. Bob Gaffey said Gary is now in a nursing care facility.
- Dee Ketterling described the Career Passport program for high school seniors. Our club participates in this activity in the county high schools, which leads to a contest for best entry from each school. - The Rotary board will meet after today's meeting.
- Trish Bishop gave her Red Badge speech, enhanced by a PowerPoint bio.
- Fran Veverka announced that the District Assembly will be April 1.
- Three host families are needed for our incoming Rotary Exchange Student in 2017-18. Each family hosts the student for three months. If interested, see Barb Walters or Rex Welker.

### **Program Highlights:**

Our current exchange student, Catalina Kenis, has been here since December 15, 2016, staying until January 25 with the family of a Delaware student, Anika Casanova, who herself previously visited Buenos Aires and stayed with Catalina's family.

Catalina gave a double report. Anika, she said, was most surprised by the close relationships between teachers and students in Buenos Aires; that students were in school for fewer hours than in Delaware; and that young people can stay up later and have no curfew in Buenos Aires.

Catalina has been most surprised by how many flags there are on display here; by the fact that people don't eat with knives as much as they do in Buenos Aires, where even pizza is eaten with a knife; and how the people here are not as portrayed in the movies they see in Buenos Aires. What does Catalina love the most? Mac and cheese, the availability of "fandom" merchandise, Christmas traditions and Christmas with snow ("It's like a movie!"); how she felt at Christmas -- that she was part of the family; her friends and the family; school with its clubs and classes and many options.

One high point of her visit was going to Cincinnati's Newport Aquarium, where her favorite moment was touching the shark.

Following that presentation, President Shelia gave a full presentation of the state of the club, going through goals of the Action Plan (reach 100 members by June 30; increase club communication; provide information to the public, and community and fundraising goals. She went through the committees and several committee chairpeople gave updates and looks-ahead.
