President Garrett shared thank you notes from Woodward Elementary students for the books that were purchased by the Delaware Rotary Club during the buy one get one book fair sale.

Program:

Marlene Casini introduced our speaker, Kassie Otten, Program Coordinator at the Delaware County Jail.

In 2014 the Delaware County Jail housed 3,866 inmates; this was a 13.14% increase from previous years. Each inmate spends an average of 20 days in the jail before being released or transferred. Most of the inmates at the jail are sentenced for DUI, probation violations and theft. The DCJ releases 95% of inmates back to the community making the issue of recidivism a top priority for Kassie Otten. The recidivism rate for the DCJ is 63.3%, in comparison to the state of Ohio which is 27.1% and 49.7% within the United States.

The issue of recidivism is a social issue within our county. Successful recovery and re-entry of inmates has an impact on everyone in our community. The DCJ has used a cross-system coordination and collaboration approach to address recidivism within our county. Pulling resources from multiple community agencies

and organizations is necessary to provide services that help inmates rehabilitate and recover. The DCJ has been able to successfully implement changes in the way we approach those individuals trapped in a continuous cycle of crime. Kassie Otten attributes Delaware County's success to growing partnerships, a holistic approach with services, and a cultural shift in thinking about how services are delivered.

Some of the key partnerships and expanded services would not be possible without community support through 105 volunteers that come from local agencies, churches and civic organizations. The Delaware County Community Health Improvement Plan 2014-2018 (CHIP) has a Mental Health priority; one of the strategies is to address screening the population for depression and/or other mental health illness. The implementation of the screening during intake identifies mental health needs of inmates and assures that these needs are met during incarceration and after they are released to the community. Many times services are initiated prior to the inmates release from the jail; this has proven to be successful because the inmates are more likely to follow through with their rehabilitation plans if the connections with support systems are in place before returning to the community.
