Program: Mike Miller introduced our speaker, Kelsey Langdale from packH2O, a nonprofit social innovation company. The company's goal is a safe alternative for transportation of water in third world countries. Greif, an industrial packing company headquartered in Delaware, manufactures the plastic backpack that holds five gallons of water. This backpack replaces the jerry can (bucket) that is utilized when walking to a well to obtain safe water.

The person obtaining the water is likely a woman who will carry 40-45 pounds of water in the can on her head. The backpack has a large strap to lighten the load on her shoulder and a spout at the bottom. The backpack can be hung up to allow for running water. The larger picture is that clean water gives a family better health, less medical bills which leads to a “step up”. One in seven persons in the world lives without access to clean water! Each pack can help five people. The company works with nonprofit aid already present in the company to educate the families about the use and cleaning of the backpack.

March 22 is World Water Day. The specific goal for that day by packH2O is to help 10,000 people.
