Program: Three speakers provided an overview of the STEP Coalition. The three speakers attended a Bridges Out of Poverty training over the last few years, and then got involved with STEP. Bridges Out of Poverty covers issues related to the poverty cycle. STEP stands for Support Through Empowerment and Partnerships and mobilizes caring community members to help provide pathways out of poverty.

STEP offers Getting Ahead training, a nationally recognized eight-week workshop for a total of sixteen classes. The group provides transportation to the training, dinner before each training and child care. The training helps attendees recognize and build resources to create a stable life in order to increase confidence and knowledge. Three classes have been offered to date that has resulted in seventeen graduates.

STEP also sponsors a monthly meeting and provides an Ally for the graduates of Getting Ahead. There is a speaker from the community who presents topics such as interviewing skills and budgeting at the monthly meetings. The Ally is a listening support system who helps provide a sense of belonging for the graduate. The Ally supports the graduate in setting priorities and making everyday decisions. STEP has realized that transportation is the greatest area of concern for those who attend the Getting Ahead trainings and others in poverty. To meet that concern, they recently applied for a grant to a Community Development agency to provide monthly bus passes to those who need it.

If you want to get involved with the STEP Coalition, you can register for the next Bridges Out of Poverty training to be held April 18 and 25 by calling the Andrews House. You can also gather a group of friends to serve and cleanup at a monthly meeting/Getting Ahead training or volunteer to become an Ally. Financial contributions are accepted to support the trainings and meetings.
