- Awards for members who have sponsored new members were announced! Frank Reinhard, Ken Spicer and Mary Jane Santos all introduced new members to our club over the last few months. All members are encouraged to bring prospect members to any of our meetings!

Program:

Mary Beth Freeman, Superintendent, and Chris Bell, Treasurer, of the Delaware Area Career Center presented information about the DACC and the upcoming facility changes. Throughout DACC's last forty years, the overall goal has always been and continues to be preparation of students for the workforce. DACC currently serves 1268 juniors and seniors from Delaware County, Westerville and Worthington. They are only one of two schools in the state to receive all As in the recent State Report Card among those career centers across the state. Enrollment has drastically increased over the last five years while operating expenses have been stable and not increasing at the same pace.

The school’s two campuses will be consolidated into the South Campus by Fall of 2018. Reasons for the move to a single site include, but are not limited to, decreased busing costs for associated districts, duplicate maintenance systems, enhanced student safety, and more resources for students including collaboration and contact time. The South Campus was chosen because it is in the center of the county and has more building renovation and expansion options. The renovations and additions will be funded through existing dollars currently available. No programs will be closed and no jobs will be lost. There are not yet specific plans for the single campus, however, ongoing communication with the community about the building plans are expected.
