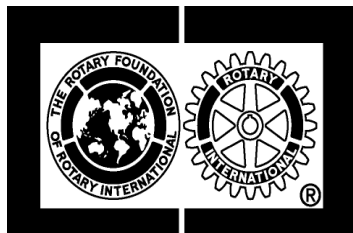

Presentation by John Tombarge

John offered statistics from the Vietnam War as recorded on The Wall. 58,267 names on the wall are arranged by death date.

- First casualty—June 8, 1956
- 3 sets of fathers/sons died in Vietnam
- 31 sets of brothers died in Vietnam
- About 39,000 killed were less than 22 years, old, 12 casualties were only 16, 5 were 15, and 1 was 15. Largest group of casualties were 19 or younger.
- 8 women died in Vietnam
- There are 153 Medal of Honor winners listed on The Wall.
