Last Meeting - Paula Roller, Domestic Violence

Paula Roller, introduced by Holly Quaine, is the Executive Director of Turning Point Shelter. October is Domestic Violence (DV) Awareness Month. Roller reported that although 95% of victims of DV are children and women, Turning Point also offers shelter to abused men and boys older than 12. DV affects all of us in terms of health care costs, health insurance costs, loss time at work, and is the single #1 reason for injuries to women in the US. DV was criminalized in 1979; Turning Point is the oldest and largest shelter in Ohio, serving a 6-county area. Its funding is from marriage license, divorce and dissolution fees as well as grants. It is also a United Way agency.

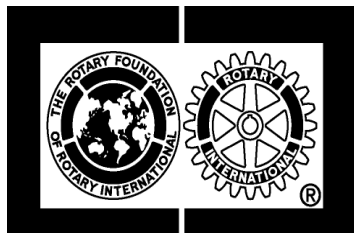
