October 20, 2014 - Today's Meeting – Representative Tiberi

October 13, 2014 – The two charities selected by our board to receive proceeds from our 12 Days of Christmas raffle ticket project made presentations.

Special Olympics of Delaware County (SODC) Executive Director Sharon Taylor let us know that SODC got its start in Delaware in the late 1970s with three sports, bowling, basketball and track & field. From that base eight more sports have been added to their program. So far this year 275 individuals have participated in Special Olympics, a huge jump compared to 1985 when they had 86 participants. Seventy-five volunteer coaches work with the Special Olympians and many venues donate space for events. Major expenses that we will help underwrite include uniforms, travel to regional and national games and supplies. Ms. Taylor read an email from a mother of a Special Olympian whose child is really enjoying the program and growing in self-confidence.

Turning Point Executive Director Paula Roller shared that they operate the largest shelter for those impacted by domestic violence in Ohio. This five county agency has operated its shelter in Marion since 1979. This facility offers housing for those in need 24/7. Volunteers and staff members also advocate for victims' rights and provide educational programs to young teens and college-age students, a strategy geared at breaking cycles of domestic violence in families. Twelve to eighteen percent of their shelter occupants and thirty to thirty-five percent of those who receive legal help from Turing Point are Delaware residents. There is a strong demand for services in Delaware and plans are underway at Turning Point to find, build or acquire a location suitable for those in need in Delaware.
