"At that time, I never decanced we might live in the mountains someday," Wayne save.

But before they could get to that happily ever after, they had to survive the honeymoon. Young Wayne had brought his prized binoculars out on a day of horseback-riding, constantly murveling at the mountain views. "Pat, you gotta take a look at this," he said, handing the binoculars to his new wife.

The outing was magical — until Pat fell off her horse. Wayne instantly turned hack to Pat with worry in his eyes. "I was really touched that my new husband would show such concern for me," Pat says.

cipient is Marty Yochum Casey. Marty has been active in the Estes Park. community, with her work on display in local buildings, such as the tile work over the fireplace at the Wayfinder Restaurant. Marty supported herself as a cook, restaurant and lodge-owner,

neurial and artistic skills that have characterized Estes Park ince its earliest begin Marty has been a driving force in the historic preserva ion of Fates Park. In the late 990s, she served as the Branch Manager of the Stanley Museum at the Stanley Hotel and created the Stanley ghost tours for Hallo special events. As President of the Estes Park Museum Friends & Foundation, Inc. she created the popular His-toric Homes Tours and launched the Friends Press

an academic press publishing books that advances the knowledge of the local and regional history of the Estes Valley. Additionally, Marty was in strumental in the formation of the Estes Park Museum Friend's endowment semmittee to help fund the Estes Park Museum for future generations
