It's Showtime!

A mix of music and ages on tap for It's Showtime!

From Bob Dylan and Bonnie Raitt to Brahms, Broadway, and de Beriot – there's an extraordinary mix of music and talent that will take the stage Friday, March 1st and Saturday March 2nd for the third annual musical variety show "It's Showtime!"

The Friday show on March 1st is at 7:00pm. The Saturday show, March 2nd, is a matinee at 2:00pm. Both performances are at Presbyterian Community Church of the Rockies, 1700 Brodie Ave, in Estes Park. Tickets are \$15 in advance or \$18 at the door for adults. Students and children free because all the money raised goes to the scholarship fund of the Rotary Club of Estes Park Foundation.

"We have a fabulous lineup of some of the best musical talent in the Estes Valley," says show director and Estes Park Rotary Club President Pete Sumey. "I guarantee you, you won't be disappointed. We'll have some familiar faces

on stage and several new ones that you may not have seen before – at least in this kind of a setting."

One of those new faces is 28-year old Colleen Buckert, a bartender at Lonigans Bar & Grill.

"I love singing and I want to give to the community," she says. "It's for scholarships, for the young kids." Buckert has lived in

Estes Park since she was ten and is an Estes Park High School graduate.

"I run karaoke on Friday nights at Lonigans and on the other nights that we do karaoke I also sing. I sing at weddings and funerals -- whatever people want."

Two years ago she sang for the judges of the TV show American Idol.

"I made it through the Hollywood Round



where I sang for the celebrity judges," says Buckert. "I sang for them at Aspen and then went on to Hollywood and sang for them a second time. They didn't show my audition on TV, but that is an experience I will never forget. It was extremely exciting. I was shocked I made it that far. I honestly didn't think that was going to happen. I was pleasantly surprised."

For "It's Showtime!" Buckert will sing the Bonnie Raitt hit "I Can't Make You Love Me."

On the other end of the show's age spectrum for new faces is 70-year old Steve Smersh. When he was a student years ago at Colorado State University, he sang in a group called Northanna Singers, which sang Civil War ballads. "We tried to look like the Kingston Trio. We'd run out on the stage with those vertically striped shirts. We had a standup bass, a banjo, and two guitars. We had a lot of fun. We were pretty popular. We sang on campus and did a couple of high school assemblies, that kind of thing."

He spent some years singing in what he calls "Gringolandia" around San Carlos, Sonora Mexico, but then came back to Colorado last year.



"I moved back to Estes Park last June and the first thing I did was put together the Silent Film Comedy Show at the Park Theater, a three-day thing that was a lot of fun," says Smersh. Rotarian Susan Day, he says, "knew that I had a little CD put together. She listened to it and loved it. She took it to Madison Casey (one of Showtime's music coordinators). He went online and listened to a few things I've got up on YouTube. So he told Sue, 'Yeah, he'd be great. Get this guy to do these Dylan things.' I said, 'Yeah, I'll do Dylan. I'll do what you want me to. I'll do a Civil War ballad if you want me to."

"I always enjoy doing benefits especially when it helps kids," says Smersh. "I'll blow

my harmonicas and do a couple of old Bob Dylan songs. He's still active. He's about my age and he's still going strong. I've always loved his music and his poetry. I've done a lot of his songs over the years and these are two of my favorites that I'm going to do for the show: "Forever Young" and "Girl from the North Country."

Joining Smersh and Buckert on stage for "It's Showtime!" will be the Estes Park High School Jazz Band, Major 13 Jazz Choir from EPHS, Valerie Dascoli and Scott Anderson in a duet of "Somos Novios." Christy Florence sings "Vanilla Ice Cream" from the show She Loves Me. Lori Burnham sings "Lascia ch'io pianga" (Let Me in Weeping") by George Handle. Ruby Bode sings a medley of songs about peace and change. Emcee and show director Betsy Skinner sings "The Alto's Lament." Larry Pierce sings "I'm Reviewing the Situation" from Oliver. Randy Boyd sings "Ama Credi e Vai" (Because We Believe"). Vic Anderson will yodel several western songs. Roger Thorp sings "Bring Him Home" from Les Misérables. Margaret Patterson will perform a Brahms piano solo. Young violinist Ted Dumont will perform the first

movement from Concerto No. 9 in A Minor by deBeriot. Bob Brunson offers the humorous talk "I Wish I Were 18 Again." The OLM Trio made up of Gary Reeves, Michelle Gergen-Wisner, and Brenda Brown will do "When the Saints Go Marching In" and "Jesus Walked this Lonesome Valley." And Elk Hollow (Jack Overly, Gary Reeves, and Dmitri Galcovski) will perform the Irish folk song "Sonny's Dream" and an original song called "My Prayer."



Old or young, new or familiar, the 18 acts you see at "It's Showtime! will send you away whistling or humming a song or two.

Tickets for the show are available in advance at Macdonald Book Shop, the Estes Park Visitor's Center, MedX of Estes, and at the Thursday Noon Rotary meetings.
