Program

Guy Van der Werf introduced our speaker, Karen Mosier Nicholson, who presented on 911 for 911. A former member of our club, she was welcomed by many friends. 911 for 911 is a nonprofit that focuses on Colorado, but aspires to have a national presence. The goal is to provide mental health support to first responders and to nurture their natural resiliency. While each first responder has the potential to save between 25,000 and 75,000 lives during his/her career, the calling/vocation exerts a heavy toll in stress, silence and suicide. Nicholson's hope is to strengthen the robust peer support already present in Northern Colorado, to train first responders to recognize symptoms of PTSD in their peers, to bring in professional help where needed, to eventually build a stand-alone first responder-only treatment facility, and to provide a national training network. Current focus is education/awareness of resources among first responders. Karen was delighted to receive a Piece of the Rock and to dedicate a book, Cows to the Rescue, to the children's library.







The meeting was adjourned with the 4-Way Test.
