

Committee Chair Tara Moenning provided the following description of each award: Academic: 3 scholarships of 4 years duration with a yearly stipend of \$2,000 (\$8,000 over 4 years). Offered on the basis of academic achievement and promise, activities and citizenship. Renewal based on the holder making normal academic progress and remaining in good academic and disciplinary standing. Carver Family Vocational: 1 2-year scholarship of \$1,000/yr. (total of \$2,000 over 2 years) for a student attending a vocational school, community

college or a 2-year technical program. Renewal based on the student remaining in good academic and disciplinary standing. The basis of this award is academic achievement and promise. Brian Archibald Memorial Art: 1 \$500 scholarship for an individual desiring to enhance his/her skills in a field of the arts and planning to enter a recognized/accredited school. Lynn Coffman: 1 scholarship of \$1,500 for 1 year for a student graduating from EPHS planning to major in business or related disciplines. The Ron L. Kuhns Memorial: 1 scholarship of \$1,000 for 1 year for a


