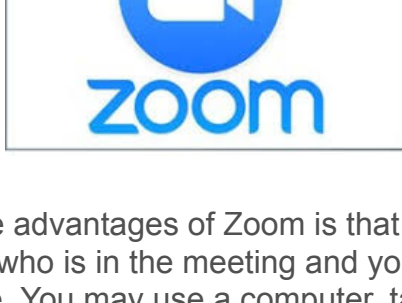

Meet the 2020 Scholars

This year, our club awarded a total of \$32,500 to nine Estes Park High School seniors to help them on their academic journeys. The students will appear on Zoom at our Thursday meeting.

Academic scholarships are funded by the club's fundraising events, including the golf tournament, Shred-a-Thon, and members' contributions. The named scholarships are memorial funds managed by the foundation. Two are recent additions: The Ron L. Kuhns Memorial Scholarship, and this year's debut award, The Bob Brunson/Roger Thorp Memorial Scholarship. Committee Chair Tara Moenning provided the following description of each award:

Academic: 3 scholarships of 4 years duration with a yearly stipend of \$2,000 (\$8,000 over 4 years). Offered on the basis of academic achievement and promise, activities and citizenship. Renewal based on the holder making normal academic progress and remaining in good academic and disciplinary standing.

Carver Family Vocational: One 2-year scholarship of \$1,000/yr. (total of \$2,000 over 2 years) for a student attending a vocational school, community college or a 2-year technical program. Renewal based on the student remaining in good academic and disciplinary standing. The basis of this award is academic achievement and promise.

Brian Archibald Memorial Art: One \$500 scholarship for an individual desiring to enhance his/her skills in a field of the arts and planning to enter a recognized and accredited school of study.

Lynn Coffman: One scholarship of \$1,500 for 1 year for a student graduating from EPHS who is planning to major in business or related disciplines.

The Ron L. Kuhns Memorial: One scholarship of \$1,000 for 1 year for a student who possesses a passion and aptitude for a unique field of study and is not receiving another Rotary scholarship.

The Bob Brunson and Roger Thorp Memorial: One \$1,000 scholarship for 1 year for a student pursuing a vocational or non-traditional field of study. Consideration given to the student's community service.

The Stanley Hotel: One scholarship of \$2,500 for 1 year for a student graduating from EPHS planning to major in Hotel and/or Restaurant Management, or a wellness-related field.

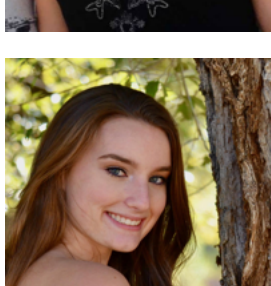

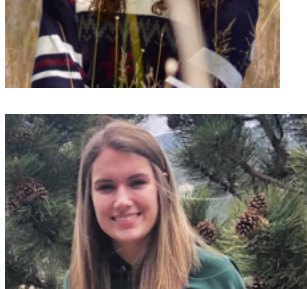

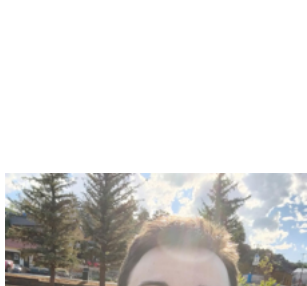
Paulina Tapia Bernal

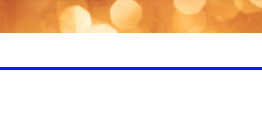
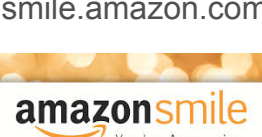
