This week's program: Financial Literacy for Women

This week's program will be presented by Andrea Anthony, who will provide information on what women should know about managing finances. She aims to help women navigate difficult financial life changes. Our speaker is well known to at least two club members, Michelle and Doug Mann, because Andrea is Michelle's sister.

Andrea Anthony, CPA, CDFA, M. Acc., has over 30 years of accounting experience and has served as a director, treasurer, and advisor for numerous boards, from nonprofits to private companies to political organizations. Her Estes Park, Colorado-based firm, Changing Tides CPA, Inc., gives her the flexibility to address a cause close to her heart—assisting women to attain financial literacy so they are no longer at risk of financial exploitation, ruin, or abuse. This includes aiding elderly women who find themselves suddenly alone and unfamiliar with financial matters as their late spouse was the one who "took care of everything."

Anthony, licensed as a Certified Public Accountant in both Florida and Colorado, is also a Certified Divorce Financial Analyst (CDFA). She provides a range of needed services:

- Divorce financial analysis
- Support services for those divorcing, separated or contemplating either
- Elder care financial counseling and assistance
- Small business and personal accounting consulting, such as company oversight, internal control reviews, cash flow management, budgeting, and cash flow forecasting.

Anthony received her Masters of Science in Accounting from the University of North Florida and began her career with the two firms that would later become Price Waterhouse Coopers. She is the Finance Director for St. John's Academy, a private school in St. Augustine, FL., where she has served for more than 25 years. Anthony has also volunteered accounting support to nonprofit humanitarian agencies in Kosovo, Albania, and Sudan. Recently, she served on the Board of Directors for The Betty Griffin Center in St. Augustine, FL., which helps local victims of domestic violence and their children. She is currently Treasurer of the Board for The Historic Stanley Home Foundation.

Member Spotlight: Matt Comstock

Each week our Spoke is profiling a member of our Club in order to get to know them better and stay connected through these socially distant times.

Matt Comstock was born in Maryland, but moved to Texas when he was 4 years old. After growing up in Houston, TX, Matt moved to Austin in 1986 to attend the University of Texas where he graduated with a degree in Advertising from the College of Communications. It was during this time that Matt met his future wife, Jennifer, and both moved to Dallas after graduation to begin careers in Advertising. They married in 1993 and celebrated their 27th anniversary in November.

Matt and Jennifer have been blessed with two children, Madison and Jack. Madison also graduated from the University of Texas in Austin, and is currently working at a digital media agency in Austin called PMG. Jack recently graduated from the Colorado School of Trades as a licensed gunsmith.

Matt has worked in the advertising industry for 30 years. Early in his career, he worked in Dallas for several global advertising agencies in their media departments. In this role, Matt developed strategies and media recommendations for international markets. In 1997, Matt took his training and experience and turned it into a career selling advertising. From 2000-2014, Matt worked at Yahoo! as a sales leader managing a team and a book of business exceeding \$150mm in advertising revenue. In 2014 Matt returned to the agency side and currently works remotely for Dallas-based Camelot Communications, a cutting-edge digital marketing company.

He stated they luckily stumbled onto Estes Park after living in Dallas for over 25 years. They would always come to the mountains in the summer to beat the Texas heat but would normally find their way to Telluride or Summit County. But it was an 18 year-old boy who brought them to Estes.

Their son was graduating high school and looking for colleges that had a great Wildlife program. He wanted to look Colorado State University and they came for a long weekend. After the college tour they hit the Big Thompson Canyon to spend the rest of the weekend in Estes Park. And while they left physically when the weekend was over, they could never get this place out of their hearts and minds. And less than three years later, they made the move!

Matt loves to do pretty much anything. But on most days, depending on the weather, you will find him for certain doing at least one of these things everyday (and usually more than one):

- Fishing - "Before coming to fly fishing country, I was a bass fisherman from Texas. The truth is, I don't care what rod I am holding or what fish I am catching, there is nothing that calms my soul like hanging with friends and family and putting a line in the water".
- Hiking - "Now this has become a big passion since moving to Estes Park. Whether it is a quick trip up to Dream Lake or a tester like hiking Mount Ypsilon, I absolutely love and need to be outside. We call it "Dirt Church" in my house because hitting the trails calms "my soul". Matt summited Longs Peak in 2019.
- Guitar - "I have played guitar for a while, but coming here and being surrounded by music has brought back the passion. I will usually practice for one hour a day on either my acoustic six string or, my newest addiction, my lap slide guitar. I finally got enough nerve to play at Ed's on their open mic night before COVID shut that down. I really want to hike a 14er this summer with a guitar on my back and play some John Denver tunes at the top. Pretty cliché I know".
- Reading - "After all that in a day, I usually need some mental down time. So I will spend a few minutes reading before the day ends. I have over 500 books downloaded on my iPad. I love pretty much any genre - history, fiction, non-fiction, mysteries, bios, graphic novels. I recently came across an author named Emily St. John Mandel. She is a really gifted story teller. Check her out".

Matt said "I am lucky to have made some fast friends in Estes Park. The first was Scott Thompson who took the time to make sure that my wife and I were set up for success in Estes Park. Among the many great things Scott did for us to make the transition a breeze was inviting me to join him for lunch at the regular Rotary meeting. My uncle, who has been one of the great personalities in my life, was a Rotarian in California and he would talk about all the great things Rotary does and the great friendships he made. Rotary was a perfect organization for me to join as it really expanded my network of friends and my knowledge of the opportunities to give time and resources to those in need".

In addition to all of these activities Matt has found the time to become Chairman of the Town Planning Commission.


