This Week's Program

"**Transitions in Primary Health Care**" with Dr. Paul Fonken



Dr. Fonken, director of Timberline Medical in Estes Park, will describe recent and upcoming changes within the primary health care system in the U.S. Further, he will explain how these changes will help address the overall health care crisis.

Paul Fonken was born in Lahore, Pakistan, received his medical training at the University of New Mexico and did his residency in family medicine at North Colorado Family Medicine in Greeley.

From 1997 through 2005, Dr. Fonken worked primarily in Kyrgyzstan helping to introduce the specialty of family medicine into this newly independent post-Soviet republic. He worked with teams from multiple organizations to train teachers of family medicine, then helped these new teachers retrain the country's primary care doctors and establish a family medicine residency, a professional association and a continuing medical education system.
