## Organizations sought for 2013 Estes Park Duck Race

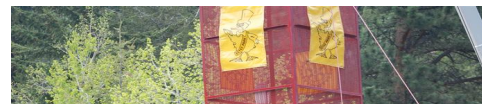

The Rotary Club of Estes Park is seeking non-profit organizations and charities who want to raise money for their own group by participating in the 2013 Estes Park Duck Race on May 4<sup>th</sup>.

Organizations sell duck adoption forms asking buyers to check off their group on the adoption form which means the group gets \$19 of the \$20 cost of the adoption.

“It’s going to be a special race this year as we celebrate our Silver Anniversary and you will want to participate in all the events we have planned,” wrote Larry Williams and Susan Day in a letter mailed out this week to 61 organizations and charities that took part in the 2012 race.

Williams and Day said there are two simple rules that must be

1) The non-profit group must have a local presence and benefit residents of the Estes Valley.

2) The organization must be named as a receiving organization on at least \$400 worth of duck adoptions (20 adoptions).

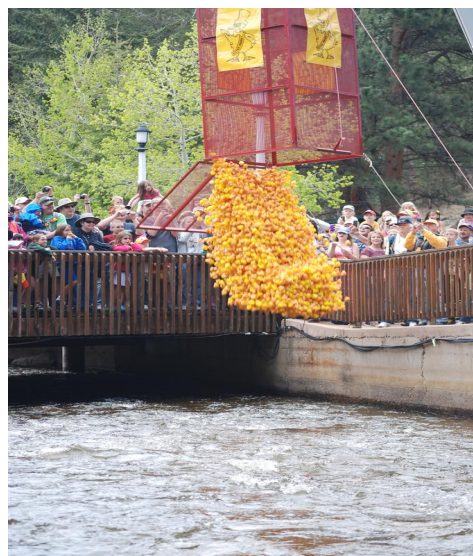

"Last year, more than \$108,000 went to 65 charities and organizations who took part in the race," said Williams. "As an example, the 8<sup>th</sup> grade Class Washington Trip Fund raised over \$13,000 in last May's race. Keep in mind 95% out of every \$20 duck adoption goes to the organizations and charities selling adoptions. The Rotary Club retains only \$1 to defray the cost of staging the race. And because this is our 25<sup>th</sup> year, we're planning some special Silver Anniversary events. Get those applications in by Dec. 31<sup>st</sup>"

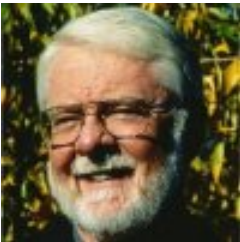

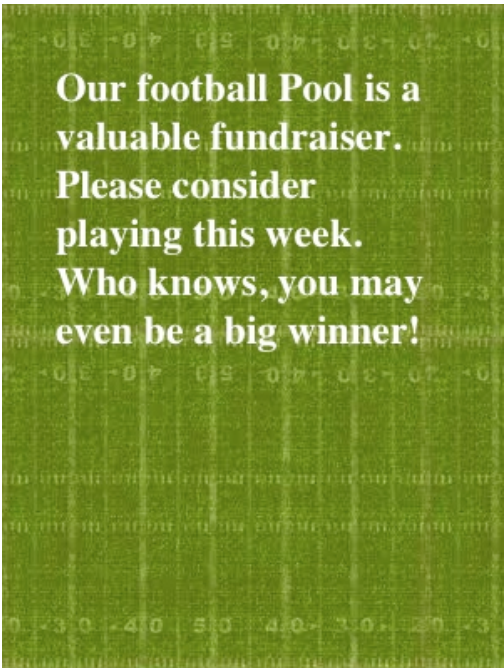
**Rotary District Governor Visits on October 25**
