### Duck Race to be livestreamed Sept. 19 **Rocky Mountain Channel to air virtual race**

In an unusual year, the Estes Park Duck Race promises to be unusual, too. This year's event on Saturday, Sept. 19 will not take place in the familiar venues, but will deliver all the excitement that comes with a traditional race. Instead of gathering at Nicky's, Riverside Plaza or The Wheel Bar, all that Duck Race fans need to do is adopt their ducks online at epduckrace.org and then tune in to Channel 8-The Rocky Mountain Channel or YouTube to view a virtual race **proDUCKtion**. The Rocky Mountain Channel's free app can be downloaded at the App Store or Google Play. All broadcast links will be available at epduckrace.org.



The Duck Race Committee is pleased to announce a partnership with Nick Mollé Productions and The Rocky Mountain Channel, which will bring the virtual race to life on Sept. 19. The broadcast will begin at 11 a.m. with a **Pre-Flight Show** featuring interviews, clips from historic footage, and appearances by mascot Lucky Duck and 'Big Duck' Karen Thompson, the leader of the 2020 flock. Sponsors of the race will be recognized, and Duck Adoptions will be encouraged. At 12:40 p.m., the broadcast will go live from the studios of Channel 8 with several socially-distanced presenters guided by Mollé and Production Manager Sean Doherty. At 1 p.m. sharp, the time of the traditional drop of thousands of little yellow plastic ducks into the Fall River, the broadcast will instead focus on an exciting, live reveal of the top prize winners. Thompson has dubbed this the **Tail Spin**.

Nick Mollé is the award-winning producer or several internationally acclaimed films, the owner of Channel 8-The Rocky Mountain Channel and an avid Duck Race fan. A former member of the Rotary


Major prizes and hundreds of Duck Buck certificates for local merchants will be drawn from a decorated raffle drum. All winners' names will be posted on the Duck Race website on race day, at epduckrace.org. Major Prizes include:

- Cash Prizes: \$2,000 and \$1,000
- Travel Prizes: Pine Lodge on Whitefish River near Glacier National Park, Explorer Cabins at Yellowstone National Park, and Tenaya Lodge at Yosemite National Park. All travel prizes are three-night accommodations for two people. Travel prizes, which have expiration dates well into 2022, include extras that vary between resorts. Delaware North, the lodging and concession corporation that includes the Ridgeline Hotel in Estes Park, generously donated the travel prizes.

Duck Adopters also will have the chance to win hundreds of other prizes valued at \$20 and up. This year the merchants were not asked to donate prizes, but instead were given the option of having prizes, called Duck Bucks, provided by the Duck Race Committee and many donors. Duck Bucks are redeemable at various local businesses; winners will be notified by email. The new Merchant Prize format this year was to offer support to local businesses that have been negatively impacted by the pandemic.

Thompson is anticipating a great event. "What a year! What an exciting Duck Race this will be! I'm thrilled that our committee has **'flown in formation'** throughout many challenges this year and has planned a virtual Duck Race that will help to 'feather the nests' of our 67 Participating Organizations during this difficult time for nonprofits," she said.

The successful club fundraiser, the Friendship Card, will expire at the end of December. A new one needs to be prepared for sale and distribution.


- The first order of business will be calling the current merchants (75) that are in the Friendship Card program to see if they want to continue in 2021 and if there are changes to their discounts or offers.

### Member Spotlight - Wayne Newsom

Wayne Newsom was born in Amarillo, Texas on June 20, 1929. We never lived in Amarillo but that was the nearest hospital. I consider Hereford, Texas as my hometown. It was known as the Town Without A Toothache, because of high fluoride in the water. I graduated from Texas Tech University in 1951, having majored in Business Management. Pat and I were married in Hereford in 1952 and have been married 68 years. We have four daughters, Karen Thompson is number 3, 13 grandchildren and 14 great-grandchildren. After farming with my brother on the family farm for about three years, I started work with Gifford-Hill Western, an agricultural irrigation company. We manufactured pivot sprinklers, PVC plastic, aluminum and rubber gasket concrete irrigation pipe. We also installed these irrigation systems on farms in West Texas, Texas Panhandle, Oklahoma Panhandle, Southwest Kansas, Nebraska Panhandle, Southeast Wyoming and Eastern Colorado. I started as office manager, went into sales for a few years and was a division manager in Garden City, Kansas, Hereford, Texas and Fort Morgan, Colorado. This is how I arrived in Colorado. I worked with this company 22 years until it sold and I became a number instead of a name. It wasn't fun anymore so I said "Adios". We had only one daughter still at home. We had a huddle to see where we wanted to live. We had bought a cabin in Estes Park with Virgil and Carol Holtgrewe in about 1968 so we moved to Estes Park. People asked why I would quit a job at 50 years old not knowing what I was going to do. I said I would find something and started as a Realtor in 1979, 41 years ago, and still enjoy the work. People ask when I am going to retire. My response is "when I get old enough" and besides I don't have a dog to walk.
