Engaging Learners: Eagle Rock's National Reform Mission With Jeff Liddle

Jeff Liddle is the new head of school at Eagle Rock School and Professional Development Center. Jeff has served as the director of the outdoor program, director of curriculum, and now head of school at Eagle Rock.

In the late 1980's, as an expression of gratitude for the success the Honda Motor Company had enjoyed in the United States, Mr. Amemiya, then president of Honda, charged two senior vice presidents with the task of identifying a significant unmet social need that Honda could help address. The desire was to give back to this country in a meaningful, significant, and long-term manner. Tom Dean and Makoto Itabashi, the men charged with this mission, spend a year traveling the country in search of such a national need. Their work resulted in identifying public secondary education as being in crisis. The dropout rate was on the rise and students were becoming more and more dis-engaged.

In 1993, Eagle Rock School and Professional Development Center opened its doors and embarked on a journey to address this crisis in public education.

This Rotary presentation will focus on the current state of public secondary education and Eagle Rock's role in helping to address the ongoing problem of dis-engaged youth across this country.
