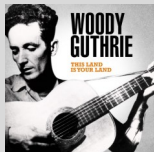

Dignity Liberia

John Turnage introduced **Becky Huner** to share updates on Dignity Liberia and their grant through the Rotary International to fund the program. Becky grew up as a missionary in Liberia and is a certified mid-wife and health nurse practitioner. Founded in 2009, **Dignity Liberia** provides healthcare to pregnant women of Liberia primarily to combat obstetric fistula. In 2019, Becky was inspired by **John Stewart** to seek a grant from Rotary International. With this grant, Dignity Liberia has been able to provide a generator to create electricity for their entire campus as well as equipment and supplies and operating and delivery tables. Phase I of their mission is complete with a “Waiting Home” for women near birth and need to be close to the hospital. Phase II includes a clinic, operating rooms, and training for mid-wives and medical aides. Dignity Liberia also provides jobs for local community members.
