Duck Race Sponsorships

Bob Tello announced the start of the gathering of sponsorships for the upcoming 2026 Duck Race. In 2025, the Duck Race generated **\$25,000 of funding** for the local Loveland Rotary Foundation.



These funds were used to provide scholarships and funding for RYLA and Young RYLA, the Exchange Student program, the 4-Way Test and other programs. In addition 76% of the funds raised by the Duck Race come from non-Rotarians. The Duck Race is the Club's largest single fundraiser and provides the largest public image boost. This is why sponsorships are so important. Bob shared two examples of how to facilitate sponsorships and offered materials and support to all Club members to help. Pulliam Building Move Update

Chris White led a program designed to provide the Club with an update on the possible moving of future meetings to the Pulliam Building. Chris guided the Club through the history of the Pulliam Building and the Loveland Rotary Club's involvement. With the formation of the foundation to restore the building, led by **Norm Rehme**, the Club committed \$175,000 of funding in return for free use of the building for future meetings. Changes during the restoration of the building did not allow for a true catering kitchen to be installed. This would not allow the Club to meet there and have lunch meetings in the same way we have had in the past. Additional challenges discussed included parking and options for break-out meeting spaces. Chris explained the various options that are available to the Club and then allowed for questions and 15 minutes of discussion at each table. To close the program Chris asked members to return their completed surveys in order to provide input and direction to Club leadership.
