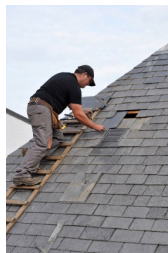
Carol Stark (TRF): Did you know that *93 cents out of every dollar* donated to The Rotary Foundation

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

Our own **George Stevens** gave us a great talk on the origin of the Juneteenth holiday and the long struggle for true freedom and civil rights that has since continued.

Some highlights: • Juneteenth commemorates the announcement of emancipation to African Americans in Galveston, TX two and a half years *after the Civil War ended!* • Without Abraham Lincoln as leader, emancipation would not likely have happened. • Believe it or not, during Reconstruction slavery really continued in a different form (trumped-up incarcerations) for a great many black Americans.
