Kevin Clark (TSD Athletic Director) and staff members Andy Liddle (Loveland H.S.) and Paul Arrington (Walt Clark M.S.) delivered a presentation on "Pros & Cons of Club Sports." After showing a poignant video about challenges that parents face, they elaborated on the joys and pitfalls of heavy involvement by parents and their kids in club (privately funded) sports activities. PROS: • Learning how to build good relationships (with teammates and coaches) is a valuable outcome. • The joy of seeing your kids pursuing their passion is real. • Kids and their parents get many opportunities to travel. • The monetary benefits of scholarships are significant. CONS: • It's unhealthy to view kids as an investment strategy. • The cost of time and money over years can be significant and wearing. • Kids can burn-out or lose opportunities if they specialize in one sport too early.
