postage stamps around the world. Some highlights...

- Many countries have recognized Rotary on special issue postage stamps since 1931 (Austria).
- Rotary anniversary years have yielded a plethora of new stamps: 27 countries in 1955 (50th), 60 countries in 1980 (75th), and 80 countries in 2005 (100th).
- The U.S., unfortunately, has had but one Rotary stamp (1955), as new postal regulations some time after that issuance prohibited commemorations of service and community organizations.
