**HISTORY:** Loveland Rotary will celebrate 100 years May 1, 2020. In the Spring of 1920, Thomas W. Potter decided he wanted to form a Rotary Club in Loveland as a way to get together with other men in the community.

**PROGRAM:** **Gail Daughtery** introduced Dr. Scott Denning who has a BA Geological Sciences from University of Main and a PhD in Atmospheric Science. He joined the CSU faculty in 1998 to teach and study atmospheric science. Dr. Denning pointed out that climate change is “simple, serious and solvable.” Simple—managing our heat budget is key. Carbon dioxide production interferes with heat leaving the surface of the earth. Serious—there are many well documented impacts of the general warming trend. Solvable—use less energy. Buildings use twice the energy that cars do so more efficient architects can help. Wind and solar energy sources are also increasing much more than forecasted.
