LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

Our own Rich Ball took us down memory lane with
his presentation on "Loveland: Then and Now." There
were many interesting highlights, including these:

- In post-war years (incl. early 1950s) everybody was happy and got along, and Loveland was an idyllic small town of 6,500 people.
- In 1948, his parents built their Lake Loveland home, which at the time was "out in the boondocks"!
- Since then, it seemed as though the city doubled in population every 10 years.
- In 1962, when HP brought new employment for more than 3,000 to the still largely agricultural town, people said, "Dad can have a bad farm year; Mom has a job!" With the incoming trained engineers, the average educational level of city residents also rose.
- One of Rich's pastimes as a teenager was sitting out, with his mom, on their porch and counting the cars coming down from Estes Park on a Sunday night. On a busy night, they counted 25 cars in 2 hours!
