"Working in Public Health During COVID" by Rebecca Hermann. Ms. Hermann, of Nederland, Colo., our own Rotary Global Grant Scholar, who just finished her master's degree in Control of Infectious Diseases, at LSHTM, University of London, UK, and who was a Fulbright Scholar for two years in Colombia, gleaned the following insights about the COVID-19 pandemic from her studies and her recent field work in contact tracing for Boulder County:

- Although not as contagious as other infectious diseases, COVID-19's "clustering" effect makes it spread very quickly in bars, churches, and college social events where safe behavior may be lax.
- COVID-19 is peculiarly insidious because of the superspreader phenomenon: a person or event that results in disease transmission to an unusually high number of people.
- People can become infectious two days before showing any symptoms, and they are thought to be most infectious during this time.
- Some people expel more viral particles than other people when they talk, sing, or shout.
- Dogs are increasingly being used to sniff out COVID-19 cases, with a 85-90% accuracy.
