Mark Turnage, CEO of DarkOwl, the cybersecurity industry's largest commercial provider of darknet data for



IMPACT OF RUSSIA'S INVASION OF UKRAINE ON CYBER WARFARE THEORY + PRACTICE

managing security risks, gave a great presentation on the little publicized backend cyberwar being fought by Ukraine against Russia. Highlights included these:

- This is the first time in history that two nation states have fought a full-time, full-blown cyberwar.
- A small country (like Ukraine) can actually have a very effective, powerful cyberwarfare capability.
- On day one of this war, Ukraine immediately asked for help from the hackers of the world (criminal and otherwise) and 250,000 hackers came to their aid.
- Russian state TV and critical infrastructure have been hacked and are still being hacked by Ukraine.
- Many U.S. (e.g., Silicon Valley) cyber companies who employ Ukrainian cyber experts have supported their families during this war.
- Russian hackers who themselves aren't sympathetic with their gov't are depleting Russian's resources.
- No treaties exist for cyberwarfare, though large-scale civilian casualties and physical damage are real.
